Many students are involved in 4-H clubs where they are involved with projects that directly connect to learning outcomes in the new CTS Program of Studies. Norma and Mary-Lou have been personally involved with 4-H for many years and were both curriculum managers during the CTS course development at Alberta Education. They will provide specific examples of how the CTS program relates to the experiences of students in 4-H who "learn to do by doing" and how CTS course delivery can connect with 4-H using off-campus experiences.

ABOUT THE FACILITATORS:

Mary-Lou Stacey is a CTS and science teacher with the School of Hope, a provincial online school within the East Central Catholic School Division. She has taught in online, blended and home education programs with the School of Hope for 12 years, including instruction in CTS, PE and Health, Biology 20 and 30, Music and grades 1 to 6 in all subject areas. Previous to her career in education, Mary-Lou was a Registered Nurse specializing in Pediatrics and Public Health. Mary-Lou was the lead curriculum manager for the new course development in Health and Human Services, Recreation Leadership, Health Care Services and Community Care Services Occupational Areas in CTS. During her role with Alberta Education, Mary-Lou worked extensively with the pilot schools and teachers in multiple jurisdictions assisting with pathway development, transitioning to the new programs of study, resource reviews, and implementation strategies for the new CTS Health pathway programs.

Norma Clark has been a classroom teacher for 30 years. During those years Norma has taught Foods, Fashions and Tourism as well as Career and Life Management for several jurisdictions. For the past three years Norma has been working with master teachers, industry, post-secondary as well as other ministries to create in the areas of Health, Recreation and Human Services, Media, Design and Communications and Natural Resources. She is passionate about the new programs and the creation of pathways for students.
