She has taught in online, blended and home education programs with the School of Hope for 12 years, including instruction in CTS, PE and Health, Biology 20 and 30, Music and grades 1 to 6 in all subject areas. Previous to her career in education, Mary-Lou was a Registered Nurse specializing in Pediatrics and Public Health. Mary-Lou was the lead curriculum manager for the new course development in Health and Human Services, Recreation Leadership, Health Care Services and Community Care Services Occupational Areas in CTS. During her role with Alberta Education, Mary-Lou worked extensively with the pilot schools and teachers in multiple jurisdictions assisting with pathway development, transitioning to the new programs of study, resource reviews, and implementation strategies for the new CTS Health pathway programs.
