### *About the session:*

Social skills can be a difficult area for Deaf and Hard of Hearing children to navigate. This series of monthly workshops are designed to help Teachers/EAs teach and nurture and support appropriate social skills for their students.

Workshops are designed for the students to attend with their Teachers/EAs although this is optional. One skill will be taught at each session using role-play, visuals, basic language and a very hands-on approach. Teachers/EAs and their students will also come away from each session with follow-up materials to continue practicing and learning when they return to their school.
