About the series: All participants will receive access to the CARC Moodle of resources and have the opportunity to collaborate and share resources on their own 21st century learning projects. Participants who sign up for all seven workshops will receive a copy of the book "21st Century Skills: Learning for Life in Our Times" by Bernie Trilling and Charles Fadel. Although these sessions will be delivered in a face to face capacity, opportunities may exist for other delivery models to be used (e.g. video conferencing, Elluminate) dependent upon learner needs and desires. Participants will form part of a community of learners who will work individually or collaboratively to create a 21st century learning project. Workshops will be on the first Wednesday of each month starting in October and concluding in May. Note: There is no workshop in December. Each workshop will have a "new knowledge" component along with a "skill development / practice" component and time will be provided in each session to work on projects.

About the session:

Engaging Students with the integration of Project Based Learning, Multiple Intelligences and Web 2.0 Tools: Are you interested in finding ways to increase the level of learning, achievement and engagement for ALL of your students? Would you like to discover how to place more responsibility for learning onto students by implementing multiple intelligence theory in your classroom? If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you need to discover along with other teachers how to make this happen in our 21st century classrooms. What's most important is not how smart your students are but how your students are smart. Samples of student work and resources will be made available along with various Web 2.0 digital tools which will be helpful for teachers with their own 21st century learning projects.
