Karla Holt Karla trained as a teacher and taught here in Alberta from 1997-2000, then moved to Liverpool, England where she worked as a Primary School Teacher (teaching children aged 5 - 11 years old). She worked at a Technology Specialist School using innovative technology in the classroom until 2007 and then managed a Study Centre at Everton Football Club, which was also a Technology Centre of Excellence, where school groups attended once a week for a 10 week period to work on technology based projects. These projects directly covered National Curriculum Objectives, but in a fun and innovative way. She worked with pupils aged 7 -14 years old at the Study Centre.
